Poverty in Arlington

The federal poverty level is a relic set in the 1960s based on food costs only. It does not take into account other costs such as housing, child care, and health care. Policy makers agree that in the absence of an updated federal poverty line, we need to adopt a measure that reflects local living costs. In Arlington, 150% of the federal poverty level is \$38,700 for a family of 4 (which is 150% of the federal poverty level). This is a more accurate reflection of poverty in our community. There are 10,000 households or 24,700 individuals living below this level. That is 11% of our population. Figures are for the most recent years they are available.
