## **Poverty in Arlington-Updated for 2023**

The federal poverty level is a relic set in the 1960s based predominantly on food costs. It does not take into account geographic variation and other costs such as housing, child care and health care. Policy makers agree that in the absence of an updated federal poverty line, we need to adopt a measure that reflects local living costs. 30% of Arlington's 2023 Area Median Income is \$45,630 for a household of 4, which is about 150% of the federal poverty level. This is a more accurate reflection of poverty in our community. Just over 10% of Arlington's population is at or below this level. The 2021 American Community (Census) Survey shows that there are over 10,000 households or 24,000 individuals living below 30% of the AMI. The figures below are for the most recent years they are available. Special thanks to Elizabeth Hardy, Arlington County Demographer, for her help with this data.
